

Getting a Safe Ride Home

Are US drivers using alternatives to avoid driving drunk?

NEW RESEARCH

by the Traffic Injury Research Foundation USA shows that:

47% of drivers are aware of services to drive them/their car home if they are intoxicated

13%

say they have used **SAFE RIDE PROGRAMS** when available

19%

have used **PAID RIDE SHARING** as an alternative to driving drunk, but there is a gender difference:

24% **14%**

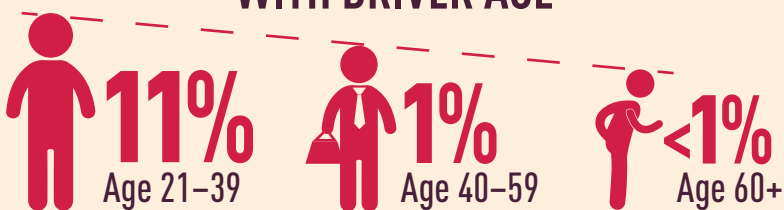
say they have used a **DESIGNATED DRIVER**
